During 2025, we have helped 6190 families have a bit more food on their tables. That is 20273 people we have helped. Our volunteers are wonderfully dedicated and show up whether the weather is 91 degrees or the temp feels like 4 below zero. (These have been actual temps during the past year.) If there is food left, Crossroads comes to pick it up and use to feed people. Thank you all for supporting this ministry of Trinity. And thank you Foodbank for the Heartland for providing this food for our community. In addition to the monthly food distribution you all help by placing food in our drive by food box. Many contributed time and work to the wonderful Haven Garden during the summer. Snacks and care bags are provided to Howard school thanks to our church. Wednesday night meals have helped feed people. When there is a lot of extra food left after an event, it is donated to Hope Harbor. The mission committee cooks and serves a Sunday night meal 4 times a year at the Salvation Army.
